

Attendance is critical to the success of your student's education. I strongly encourage your students to attend school every day, and log in to their Zoom classes when we are in remote learning.


I encourage all of your students to become involved in some kind of activities during their middle school years. If you have any questions regarding what is offered at CMS, please do not hesitate to contact me.

GREENHOUSE

Cuba schools is currently in the process of constructing what is known as a classroom greenhouse. Superintendent Karen Sanchez-Griego, Mrs. Lavern Wagner, and Mr. Ray Sisneros developed a plan to construct the greenhouse as a result of student interest in horticulture during the summer's Three Sisters Gardening program. In conjunction with the greenhouse Cuba Schools is also offering 2 horticulture classes, one at the high school and one at the mid school.



Once the greenhouse is completed in late October students will go to class in the greenhouse and learn various aspects of how to grow, harvest, and propagate all types of plants. Each student will have an individual plot where they can grow a variety of plants. Students will also grow houseplants, fresh vegetables, flowers, shrubs and fruit trees. We are looking forward to bringing back a horticulture program like Cuba had back in the 1970s and early 80s. We will have an open house as soon as the greenhouse is operational.


Physical Education and Health Teacher: Laura Warner


ELA, Reading, and Social Studies Teacher: Andrea Irangan
